• We have had great attendance which includes some of our Brazilian church members and also neighbors and a few English students. We continue to have great participation online via Zoom as well. Several devices connect with us from Florida, Texas and, of course, Brazil.

• We share a meal together and then start the study afterwards.


ENGLISH CLASSES

• This year we have lost some LST students. However, we have kept some of the old students who continue to study English and the Bible with us. The good news is that we also have quite a few new students as well. One example is a couple from Sao Paulo. Their names are Paulo and Vanessa. They have been in the USA for many years.

They both have conversational English and are able to follow along with the LST booklet. I am studying the Gospel of Luke with them in English.

• Another good news is that we have started a group class on Thursday evenings. This class is taking place at the church building in Coral Springs. We have a total of 5 students that are taking basic English lessons.

WORK IN THE SPRINGS CHURCH OF CHRIST, IN CORAL SPRINGS

• The beginning of the year was marked by a quick surge of the Omicron variant all over the country. Florida was no different and several church families caught it in the first few weeks of the year. We praise the Lord that everybody here in our congregation only developed mild symptoms.

• For about four weeks, starting in mid-December, we started collecting specific items and put together 10 packages to be sent to Christian refugees. The organization we worked with was Voice of the Martyrs. The whole congregation joined forces in this effort, and it was so rewarding to see so many people being involved. On January 15 we had a meal together at church after the worship service and put together the packages which were sent out the following week.

• We continue to have good number of Brazilians who are attending with us on Sundays, even though we are still only offering bilingual services in Spanish-English. On Sunday, January 30, we had a total of 15 Portuguese speakers at church with us! On that day, after church, we all went out and ate lunch together.

• In late February the Springs Church of Christ celebrated their 8th anniversary!

Everybody was really impressed and pleased with our project and we all left very happy and hopeful that the Lord will bless our mission together here in South Florida. We are eager to share with you news about the project as everything develops.

• The Liras are set to move to South Florida now in March. They already found an apartment in Boca Raton and will spend several weeks settling down and adjusting to their new life here in America. We're so joyful and excited to have them here with us!

• As you all know, Tati's R-2 paperwork arrived in late December! This has allowed us to now finally start making plans for a really anticipated trip to Brazil to visit family and friends! Joanna and our families will meet at last!!

• We have bought tickets and will be in Brazil from late March until early May. While in Brazil, besides spending time with loved ones, we will also:

o Have an appointment at the American consulate in Porto Alegre. This will be the final step in our visa saga as we need to get the actual R1-R2 visas stamped in our passports so that we will be allowed to re-enter into the USA!

o Work with some of the local churches of Christ in our hometown and the area. Maikon will be preaching a series of sermons on Sundays in our congregation in Novo Hamburgo and in Porto Alegre. Tati will be hosting a ladies afternoon tea and Bible study on Saturday, April 9, in Porto Alegre.
